FROM THE PASTOR...

In March Bishop Kagan approved my 2018 sabbatical, which has been scheduled for January-March. Priests of the Diocese of Bismarck are eligible for a sabbatical after their first 10 years of service to the Diocese and can request another every 5 years thereafter. As you may remember, I was scheduled for a sabbatical in early 2012 but due to my transfer in mid-2011, it was delayed to 2013. Every priest can take a sabbatical; they only have to plan and apply. I can personally attest to the importance of a sabbatical and as the current Director of Continuing Education for Clergy, I see the many ways sabbaticals impact clergy in a positive manner. A sabbatical must be differentiated from a vacation or period of relaxation and/or recreation. A sabbatical is a prolonged period of time away from a priest's normal assignment under a planned and approved program of study and reflection for spiritual development/renewal and theological learning. Think about it in a different way, using a concept that farmers (and you) already know; leaving a field fallow increases productivity and keeps the soil healthy. And so it is with a sabbatical. My sabbatical program in 2018, as it was in 2013, will be based in Arizona. While I am on sabbatical, Fr. Dosch will maintain the parish, with the assistance of our deacons and staff, as well as the assistance of our In-Residence priest, Fr. Hochhalter, as needed. I know you will be well taken care of.

The Annual St. Wenceslaus Remembrance Mass will soon be here. On Sunday, November 05 we will remember and honor those parishioners whose funerals were held at or planned through St. Wenceslaus over the last year (October 2016—September 2017). This special Mass will be held at 2:00 pm and will fulfill the Sunday Obligation. We personally invite each family, by way of written communication to a family point of contact, to attend and they are welcome to bring extended family and friends. I would like to invite you to consider attending this year as well. The Mass, which I have often said is one of my favorite celebrations of the year, beautifully remembers our deceased and gives hope and comfort to everyone, not just those whose loved one is being honored. There is something peaceful and healing about the Remembrance Mass; it is a Liturgy filled with the Holy Spirit and experienced in memorable and tangible ways.
